
# Proposed Craigieburn North Local Area Traffic Management Plan

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### HUME CITY COUNCIL **Keeping Craigieburn North on the move** Have your say on local traffic management

As part of Hume City Council's ongoing commitment to Local Area Traffic Management (LATM), Council is undertaking a study of traffic issues within Craigieburn North Area bounded by Craigieburn Road, Aitken Boulevard, Hume Highway and Malcom Creek. In September 2021 Council sought community input into the LATM via an online mapping tool to identify areas for consideration or improvement. More than 210 responses were received from the community. This feedback has been reviewed and used to form the basis of a proposed traffic management plan to address the issues raised by the community. In addition to community input, the study has considered:

- Traffic speeds and volumes
- Casualty crashes
- Pedestrian and cycling connectivity
- Parking issues.

Council is proposing to install traffic treatments as shown on the enclosed Proposed Traffic Management Plan. These proposals are preliminary, and before Council makes any decisions on the treatments, we would like to hear your opinions on what is being proposed.

If you would like to provide feedback on the proposed treatments, please do so using the online interactive mapping tool. This tool allows you to consider further information such as traffic volume and speed count data. Online you can read the comments made by community members and add to the community discussion.

#### Local Area Traffic Management Study Process

- 1. Seek community feedback on traffic issues within the Craigieburn North area (completed)
- 2. Investigate and develop a draft plan to address the issues (completed)
- 3. Share the draft plan with the local community (also be available online) for feedback (now)

Note: Funding of up to \$225,000 has been proposed in the 2023/24 Council budget to commence implementation of actions. Projects that are beyond the scope of this initial funding will be considered for future funding under Council's Capital Works Program.







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
